- Mac's Jackpot started alertly from post seven and finished fourth in the Pace Elimination and drew post two in the Final. Post two is four for 40 [10%] in Pace Finals.
- David Miller after the elimination, "The trip was great. I left and got away second, Huntsville retook I sat third the whole way. I got forth, he didn't get up to stretch quite as good as I wanted him to but he made the cut and we're in. For the final the draw was fortunate, hopefully a similar trip can make us some money!"
- Trainer Jim Campbell said Mac's Jackpot had a good trip but didn't finish strong enough. "Scoped him and he does a have a little mucus in there, got to get to work to get that cleared up for next week. Hoping good things for the final, but has a good post and he is a pretty versatile horse. Needs to trip out in reality hopefully that happens and he is healthy and we can get a good chunk of it!"

- Mac's Jackpot won a division of the Thompson Geers at Tioga Downs in a career best 1:50.2 on July 2 with Jim Marohn, Jr. driving.
- "He raced really well at Tioga," said trainer Jim Campbell. This is a different level, but he's a good gaited, big strong colt. He's got the speed and everything. We just hope he can take it to next level. It's going to be a tough field. Huntsville stands out in there, but anytime you're racing in a race like the Meadowlands Pace there are always horses that step up that maybe don't look as good in the program. There's never an easy spot at the Meadowlands. It doesn't matter what the class is. "
- Mac's Jackpot finished fifth and failed to make the North America Cup Final, then finished second in the NA Cup Consolation.
- He rallied from post nine to pull a huge 42-1 upset in a division of the Somebeachsomewhere at Mohawk Raceway in 1:51.4 on June 3.

- In 2016, Mac's Jackpot won a leg of the Kindergarten Classic Series at the Meadowlands in 1:51.4 on September 17 and finished the year with a third in the second leg and a fourth in the Final at the Meadowlands in November to finish out his freshman season.
- Mac's Jackpot's biggest win as a two year old came in a \$81,705 division of the Nassagaweya at Mohawk in 1:52 on August 20, 2016. He began his freshman campaign with a strong second place finish in the PA AllStars at Pocono Downs in June.
- This is trainer Jim Campbell's eleventh Pace starter. Campbell, 55, along with his older brother, driver John Campbell, finished second with Armbr Animato in 2003. Other Jim Campbell standouts include Galleria, Broadway Hall and Hambletonian Oaks winner Broadway Schooner.
- Dave Miller, 52, from Columbus, Ohio, became the second leading driver in history on July 3, passing Ron Pierce with \$254 million, and has been a regular at The Meadowlands since 1999. Despite taking the first few months off last year, Miller posted a personal best \$12.6 million season. The 2014 Hall of Fame inductee garnered his second straight Driver of the Year title and third overall. Miller also became the fifth driver in history to pass 12,000 wins and drove his second Horse of the Year, Always B Miki, who became the sport's fastest ever with a 1:46 mile in Lexington. Miller won a record five Breeders Crown on a single card in 2015 and was inducted into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2010.
- Earlier this season, Miller won both eliminations for the North America Cup with stablemates Fear The Dragon and Downbytheseaside. In that final, "The Buckeye" chose to drive Fear The Dragon and won his second straight NA Cup Final. Miller is looking for his first Pace trophy in 17 finals. His best finish was a second with Always B Miki in 2015.
- This is owner Jeff Snyder's thirteenth Pace finalist. He has won the Pace three times with Cam's Card Shark in 1994, Rocknroll Hanover in 2005, and co-owned 2009 champion Well Said.
- His super sire Somebeachsomewhere suffered his only career loss in 21 starts in the epic 2008 Meadowlands Pace, upset by Art Official in a world record of 1:47. Somebeachsomewhere, a son of the late 2002 Pace champion, was named 2008 Horse of the Year. He sired 2013 Pace winner Captaintreacherous from his first crop and sends out half of the ten finalists this year.
- Mac's Jackpot is out of the O'Brien Award winning mare Michelle's Jackpot and hails from the same family as Snyder's first Pace winner, Cam's Card Shark, as well as 2012 Canadian Horse of the Year Michael's Power.
